

**IN THE MUNICIPAL COURT OF THE CITY OF RINCON

**ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER REGARDING COURTROOM DRESS CODE AND
DECORUM**

WHEREAS the Municipal Court of the City of Rincon is charged with the fair, orderly, and efficient administration of justice; and

WHEREAS the Court possesses the inherent authority to regulate proceedings before it and to ensure proper decorum and respect for the judicial process; and

WHEREAS appropriate attire and respectful conduct are essential to maintaining the dignity of the Court and the integrity of judicial proceedings;

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED AND ADJUDGED as follows:

1. Applicability

This Order applies to all persons entering or appearing in the Municipal Court of the City of Rincon, including but not limited to defendants, witnesses, attorneys, and spectators.

2. General Standard of Dress

All individuals shall be dressed in a manner that is clean, neat, and appropriate for a courtroom setting. Attire should be consistent with that worn for a business appointment, professional meeting, or job interview.

3. Courtroom Decorum

All persons shall conduct themselves in a respectful and orderly manner toward the Court, the presiding Judge, court personnel, and all participants in the proceedings.

4. Prohibited Attire

The following attire is prohibited in the courtroom:

- Hats or head coverings (except for sincerely held religious beliefs or bona fide medical reasons)
- Sunglasses or tinted eyewear (except as medically necessary)
- Garments that are excessively revealing, including but not limited to tank tops, halter tops, tube tops, crop tops, or clothing exposing the abdomen or undergarments
- Clothing displaying profanity, obscene or offensive language, or images depicting violence, drugs, gangs, or alcohol

- Shorts, cutoffs, or excessively short skirts
 - Clothing that is see-through, excessively baggy, sagging, or not properly secured at the waist
 - Athletic attire, including sweatpants, jogging suits, spandex, or similar garments
 - Sleepwear, pajamas, slippers, or bedroom footwear
 - Camouflage clothing not associated with active military service
 - Accessories or adornments that are disruptive, distracting, or pose a safety concern

5. Enforcement

The Court reserves the authority to determine whether attire or conduct is appropriate. Any person not in compliance with this Order may be:

- Denied entry to the courtroom;
 - Required to leave the courtroom; and/or
 - Directed to return at a later date, which may result in a continuance of the matter.

6. Accommodations

Reasonable accommodations shall be made for individuals based on sincerely held religious beliefs, medical conditions, or disabilities, consistent with applicable law.

7. Effective Date

This Order shall become effective immediately upon execution and shall remain in full force and effect until modified or rescinded by further order of the Court.
